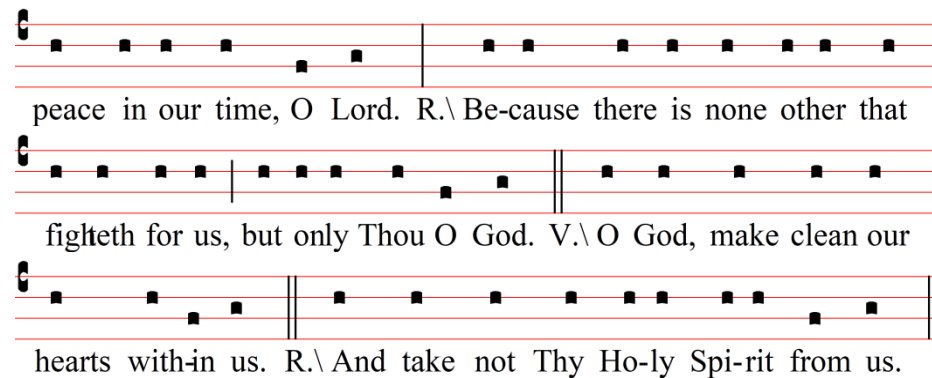
First Evensong

Joyful in Thine appearing.

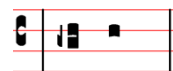

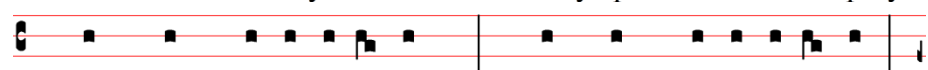
I believe in God,






