And purge away each error past.

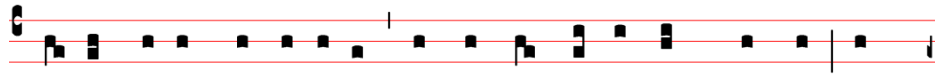


My soul doth magni-fy the Lord: and my spi-rit hath re-joiced in God
